

Call for Application – gLINK Scholarships

gLINK (Sustainable Green Economies through Learning, Innovation, Networking and Knowledge Exchange) is an Erasmus Mundus Action 2 project with financial support by the European Commission.

The aim of the gLINK project is to promote multi-disciplinary advanced research, education and professional training on sustainable green solutions through mutual collaboration and knowledge exchange between the higher education institutes (HEIs) in Europe and Asia. A number of scholarships are available from EU to Asia and vice versa.

The gLINK partnership is composed of 18 partner institutions. The International Graduate School for Dynamics in Logistics (IGS) of the University Bremen is one of the European Partners. The following Asian universities are possible destinations for a mobility:

Grants for Outgoings

The call of the 3. Cohort of gLINK is open until December 31, 2016. From EU to Asia, scholarships in the following categories are offered:

- Undergraduate for 4 months (monthly 1,000 Euro living expenses)
- Masters for 4 months (monthly 1,000 Euro living expenses)
- PhD for 6 months (monthly 1,500 Euro living expenses)
- Post-doc for 6-10 months (monthly 1,800 Euro living expenses)
- Academic staff for 2 months (only for academic staff of the partner universities; 2,500 Euro per month living expenses)

All grants will cover return travel expenses, insurance, and bench fee (if applicable). **German or European citizens are eligible for an outgoing gLINK scholarship.** Through gLINK, a number of scholarships will be available to the talented students and staff to promote European HEIs as 'centres of excellence' in thinking green, teaching, research and professional practice, and to enhance the attractiveness, image, visibility and accessibility of the European higher education and research in the participating third countries in Asia.

Promoting Cooperation between Bremen and Asia

Erasmus Mundus is a cooperation and mobility programme in the field of higher education funded by the European Commission. It aims to enhance the quality of European higher education and to promote dialogue and understanding between people and cultures through cooperation with third countries. In addition, the programme contributes to the development of human resources and the international cooperation capacity of higher education institutions in the involved countries by increasing mobility between the European Union and third countries. Erasmus Mundus offers scholarships for incoming and outgoing students and researchers on all levels of education.

The International Graduate School for Dynamics in Logistics (IGS) at the University of Bremen is partner in three Erasmus Mundus projects, gLINK (Sustainable Green Economies through Learning, Innovation, Networking and Knowledge Exchange), FUSION (Featured eUrope and South Asia mObility Network) and cLINK (Center of Excellence for Learning, Innovation, Networking and Knowledge).

Welcome for a mobility from Asia to LogDynamics are students and researchers who are interested in research according to the field 'Dynamics in Logistics'. Each German citizen can apply for a mobility to one of the partner universities in Asia.

Due to the fact that the University of Bremen has only a few study programmes in English, LogDynamics offers any applicant an individual research project, in English, and to work under individual supervision.

Fellows will be integrated into the IGS and into the working group of her/his supervisor in one of the four participating faculties Production Engineering, Business Studies/Economics, Mathematics/Computer Science, Physics/Electrical Engineering.

The programme at the IGS comprises an Airport pick-up service as well as an accompanying service and soft skill courses for all Erasmus Mundus guests. The International Office of the University of Bremen offers a broad support for finding a flat or getting started at the University of Bremen. Fellows will also have the chance to take classes in other participating partner universities.

The IGS doctoral candidates, the Erasmus Mundus guests and the researchers of LogDynamics benefit from these exchanges and from the training of cross-cultural and multi-disciplinary cooperation on a daily base. That will lead to sustainable and resilient international partnerships. 44 mobilities have already been carried out from Bremen to Asia and vice versa. Details of all offers are available online at
