

Academic Writing

In this course for international doctoral candidates and guest researcher a number of scientists from different departments come together and work on their academic writing skills. The class focuses on vocabulary, style and structure of academic texts.

The participants polish short pieces of individual writing in small groups and also take part in workshops such as „Basic Rules of Academic Writing“ or „How to Write an Abstract“. The course is tailored to the individual needs and questions of the participants. All students can work on their specific research topics and discuss their writing within an international and interdisciplinary group.

Course Format

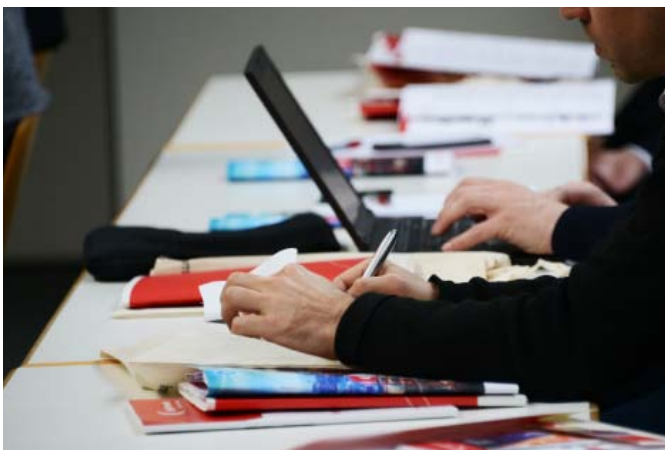
Over a period of six months the students meet on a two-weekly or monthly basis, Tuesdays between 9:00 to 12:15 a.m., to improve their writing skills in 90 minute units. Specific language topics alternate with discussions and analysis of individual writing samples in small groups.

Karolin Halmai-Samel has been a lecturer at the International Language Center of the University of Bremen since 1998. She teaches technical English, Business English and English for Academic Purposes at the university as well as at the University of Applied Sciences in Bremen. Holding a Master's Degree in English and American Studies from the University of Hamburg she also spent a number of years in the USA and Great Britain. Her teaching expertise includes many years of experience with international and interdisciplinary groups.
